**Paragraph indent:** 1 cm / 0.39 inch

**Font** TNR 12 pct, 1.5 line spacing (spacing before: 0, after: 0).  
Use “Text paragraph” style from the CESWP template.

**Alignment:** Justified

**Sections should be numbered** from 1 to n.  
Sub-sections: 1.1, 1.2...1.n; 2.1...2.n  
**Please do not use automatic numbering.** The ‘Introduction’ and ‘Conclusions’ sections should not be numbered.

**Footnote:** Use footnotes only for additional info & clarifications. They should not consist only of a reference citation: TNR 10, single space, justified.

Please use **no more than two heading levels**. Do not use two consecutive headings without text in-between.

When a **direct quotation** is used, always include the author, year, and page number as part of the citation and please include double quotation marks (“”).

When a **citation** is used, source material must be documented in the body of the paper by citing the author(s) and year of the sources. Two or more works in the same citation should be ordered alphabetically, then chronologically.

In sources with **more than 2 authors** the reference should include only the first author’s last name followed by “*et al.*” (first author’s surname “*et al.*”, year), while in the references list you need to include all the authors.

**Bullets & Numbering:** use **simple lines** or **Arab numbers**, TNR 12, Hanging: 0.63 cm. Use “**List bullets**” style from the **CESWP template**.

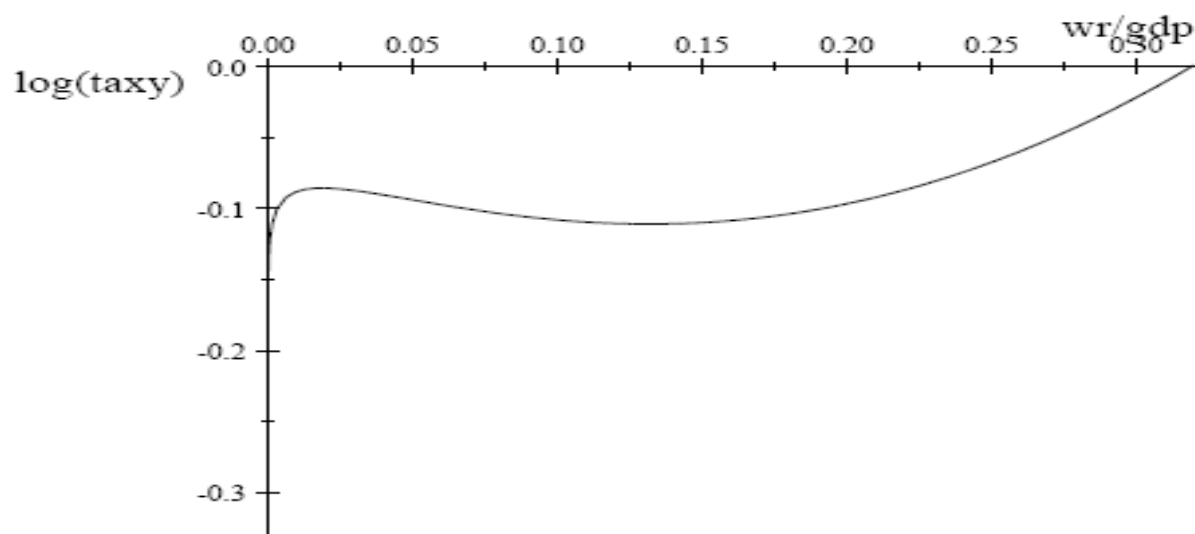
A **quotation with 40 or more words** should be included in block format (without quotation marks) apart from the surrounding text – **indent: left & right 0.5 cm**. Use “**Quote**” style from the **CESWP template**.

Images, graphs and maps should be named “**Figure**” and counted from 1 to n. TNR 12, Bold, Justified.

Insert only jpg. or png. formats, high-quality (min. 300 dpi). For all the text in the figure use only TNR font.

All figures should have the width of the page.

Source: please indicate the author, TNR 10 pct

Please keep only **relevant and reasonably large tables** in the text. Other tables should be included in an appendix at the end of the paper.

All tables should have the **width of the page**. Info inside tables should be written with **TNR font, 12 pct, single spaced**, with a double border line at the top and bottom of the table. Please use **period (“.”)** as decimal separator.

Please indicate the source of data. If using data from a well-known database (Eurostat, World Bank, etc.) it is not necessary to also describe it in the references section.

**Math equations** could be submitted as **editable text** and not as images. Present simple formula in line with normal text where possible and use “/” instead of a horizontal line for small fractional terms.

**Acknowledgements** should be included at the end of the article before the references (do not include them as a footnote to the title or otherwise).

The complete references list is placed at the end of the paper, listed in alphabetical order. It should be **single spaced, TNR, size 12, hanging: 1 cm**; Use **“References”** style from the **CESWP template**.

Please consider the examples in the next section.

## How to cite

### General recommendations:

- Avoid unreliable sources (e.g. sources with no author/date). Peer reviewed sources, like journal articles and scientific books should be the core of your references.
- Make sure that every source cited in the text has been also included in the references list (and vice versa).
- Indicating the page number for citations is recommended (and required for quotations).
- Keep the original title for sources that are not in English, but make sure you are using the Latin alphabet.
- Make sure that the final list of sources is sorted in alphabetical order (with no separation by publication type: book, journal, etc.).
- You may want to shorten very large links (use: <http://www.webcitation.org/archive.php>).

### Citation in text

Source with one author:	Smith (2013, p. 52) indicate that... <i>or</i> (Smith, 2013, p. 52)
Source with two authors:	Smith and Danson (2013, p. 52) indicates that... <i>or</i> (Smith and Danson, 2012, p. 52)
Source with more than two authors:	(Smith <i>et al.</i> , 2013, pp. 52-53)
Two or more works in the same citation (alphabetically, then cronologically):	Several authors indicate (Danson, 2013; Smith <i>et al.</i> , 2013; Wiley, 2010; 2014)

### Citation in reference list

<i>Book with one author</i>	Smith, M. (2013), <i>Pocket guide to cultural assessment</i> , London: Routledge.
<i>Book with two authors</i>	Smith, M. and Danson, M. (2012), <i>Regional Governance, Institutions and Development</i> , London: Routledge.
<i>Book with more than two authors</i>	Smith, M., Whitman, G. and Danson, M. (2012), <i>Regional Governance, Institutions and Development</i> , London: Routledge.
<i>Chapter in book</i>	Smith, M. (2014), European institutions, in: Hill, G. and Perry, J. (eds.), <i>European political framework</i> , London: Routledge, pp. 17-40.
